RECENT RESULTS: Yesterday's game against the White Sox was postponed due to rain. The Tigers lost 10-6 to the Chicago White Sox on Monday afternoon at Comerica Park, snapping the club's three-game winning streak. Zach Miner (1-1) started for the Tigers and took the loss after allowing eight runs on nine hits in 3.1 innings of work. Ramon Santiago matched a career-high with three hits, including a three-run home run, while Josh Anderson finished with a single, double and three RBI. The Tigers conclude the first homestand of the season this afternoon with the final game of a rain-shortened series with the Chicago White Sox. The Tigers hit the road for nine games beginning Friday evening, featuring stops in Seattle, Anaheim and Kansas City.

CABRERA AND GUILLEN CONNECT AGAINST CONTRERAS: Miguel Cabrera is batting .700 (7x10) with a double, three RBI and three walks against White Sox starter Jose Contreras. Cabrera leads all players with at least 10 plate appearances against the righthander with the .700 batting average and a .769 on-base percentage. Carlos Guillen is batting .400 (16x40) with a triple, three home runs, nine RBI and 10 walks against Contreras. Guillen leads all players with the 10 walks against Contreras, while he is tied for second with three home runs and third with nine RBI.

BASES LOADED BONANZA: Tigers hitters are batting .462 (6x13) with two doubles, a home run and 18 RBI with the bases loaded this season. The Tigers lead the American League with the 18 RBI, while ranking second with the .462 batting average and fourth with an .846 slugging percentage. Miguel Cabrera leads all active players with a .444 batting average (36x81) with the bases loaded during his career, while Carlos Guillen ranks fourth with a .414 batting average (46x111).

BULLISH BEHAVIOR: After allowing seven runs (five earned) in the first two games this season, Tigers relievers have posted a 2-0 record and 2.14 ERA (21.0IP/5ER) in the last six games. Opponents are batting .160 (12x75) against Tigers relievers during that stretch.

TAKE A WALK: Tigers hitters collected nine walks on Monday against the White Sox and have collected 26 walks during the homestand. The Tigers are third in the American League with 36 walks this season. The Tigers are second among all American League clubs with a .372 on-base percentage.

TAKE A SEAT: Tigers pitchers recorded 10 strikeouts on Monday afternoon against the White Sox and have fanned 34 batters in 36.0 innings pitched during the current homestand. The Tigers are fourth in the American League with 60 strikeouts this season.

POLANCO MOVING UP THE ALL-TIME SECOND BASE LIST: Placido Polanco played in the 481st game of his career at second base for the Tigers on Monday afternoon against the White Sox. With two more games played at second base, Polanco will move into a tie for eighth place in franchise history with Germany Schaefer.

CABRERA'S APRIL POWER SHOWER: Miguel Cabrera is among the major league leaders in numerous offensive categories during the month of April since the start of the 2004 season. Cabrera is tied for second among active players with 100 RBI during that stretch, while he is fourth with a .595 slugging percentage, fifth with 31 home runs, tied for seventh with 88 runs scored and eighth with a .327 batting average (151x462).

INGE REACHES 1,000 CAREER GAMES: Brandon Inge played in the 1,000th game of his major league career on Monday afternoon against the White Sox, all coming with the Tigers. Inge became the 14th active major league player to play in 1,000-or-more games all with the same team. Inge is the 30th player in franchise history to play 1,000 games and the first to reach the milestone since Bobby Higginson.

AMONG THE AL LEADERS SINCE 2005: Magglio Ordonez, Placido Polanco and Carlos Guillen are among the American League leaders in batting average since the start of the 2005 season. Ordonez is tops among all league players during the stretch with a .322 batting average (671x2083), while Polanco is third with a .320 batting average (640x2001) and Guillen is 11th with a .304 batting average (573x1886).

ZUMAYA'S INJURY REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Joel Zumaya joined Single A Lakeland to begin an injury rehabilitation assignment Saturday. He started for Lakeland Saturday night versus Tampa, allowing two runs (one earned) on one hit as he issued two walks and fanned one batter in an inning of work. Zumaya has been on the disabled list since March 27 with a sore right shoulder.

ARMANDO'S ANTIDOTE: In his second season with the Tigers, Galarraga is making his second start of the 2009 season this afternoon against the White Sox.

OPENING DAY FIRST: Galarraga made the Tigers Opening Day roster, marking the first time he has been on an Opening Day roster at the major league level.

RECORD AT COMERICA PARK: Galarraga is making his 15th career start at Comerica Park this afternoon. In his previous 14 starts, he is 6-3 with a 3.95 ERA (86.2IP/38ER).

LIMITING THE HITTING: Since joining the Tigers prior to the 2008 season, Galarraga has limited opponents to 7.61 hits per nine innings. He ranks third among American League pitchers during that span, while he is also third with a .225 batting average against.

ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES: Galarraga limited righthanded batters to a .174 batting average (52x299) during the 2008 season, tops among all American League pitchers. In his major league career, he has held righthanded batters to a .178 batting average (58x326).

RISP MANAGEMENT: During his major league career, Galarraga has limited opponents to a .234 batting average (32x137) when hitting with runners in scoring position. Opponents hit .222 (28x126) against him with runners in scoring position in 2008.

ROOKIE LEADER: Galarraga topped all American League rookie pitchers with 13 wins and 126 strikeouts for the Tigers during the 2008 season, while he finished third with a 3.73 ERA.

WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC PARTICIPANT: Galarraga started two games for Venezuela during the World Baseball Classic this spring. In his two starts, he finished 1-0 with a 4.91 ERA (7.1IP/4ER) and six strikeouts.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Galarraga was acquired by the Tigers from the Texas Rangers in a two-player deal on February 4, 2008. He originally signed with the Montreal Expos as a non-drafted free agent on October 31, 1998.
