RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers defeated the Angels 12-10 last night at Angel Stadium of Anaheim. Juan Rincon (1-0) allowed one run on two hits in an inning of relief to pick up the victory. Curtis Granderson, Magglio Ordonez, Brandon Inge and Adam Everett all finished with three hits, while Granderson and Inge both belted solo home runs. Placido Polanco added two hits and two RBI, while Carlos Guillen finished with two hits and one RBI. The Tigers continue a nine-game road trip this evening with the final game of a three-game series against the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim. The club concludes the road trip with a three-game series at Kansas City beginning tomorrow evening.

GRANDY'S STEADY SLUGGING ON THE ROAD: Curtis Granderson belted a solo home run last night against the Angels, his third home run of the series and fifth on the road this season. Granderson is second among all American League players with a .558 slugging percentage on the road since the start of the 2007 season. During that stretch, Granderson has collected 36 doubles, 18 triples and 29 home runs in 158 games on the road.

BUNCH OF BASE HITS AT ANGEL STADIUM: The Tigers finished last night's game against the Angels with 18 hits, marking the team's second-highest total at Angel Stadium of Anaheim. The 18 hits are the most by the Tigers at Angel Stadium since collecting 20 hits in a 15-3 victory on June 28, 1966.

MAGGLIO'S SLEW OF SINGLES: Magglio Ordonez has recorded 17 consecutive singles to begin the season. The 17 hits without an extra-base hit matches the longest streak by a Tigers player since at least 1954. John Knox also recorded 17 consecutive singles to begin the season from April 7, 1974 until July 14, 1974.

ORDONEZ ON FIRE AT ANGEL STADIUM: Magglio Ordonez is batting .368 (64x174) with nine doubles, a triple, 11 home runs and 32 RBI in 45 games during his career at Angel Stadium of Anaheim. He leads all active players with a .368 batting average, while he is second with a .419 on-base percentage and third with a .621 slugging percentage.

MAGGLIO'S MULTIPLE RBI: Magglio Ordonez finished last night's game against the Angels with two RBI, marking his second game multi-RBI game of the season. The Tigers are 2-0 in his two multi-RBI games this season and have posted an 80-28 record in his 108 games with multiple RBI since joining the club prior to the 2005 season.

SWINGING THE BEST AGAINST THE WEST: Since the start of the 2007 season, Tigers hitters are batting .285 (819x2869) with 147 doubles, 34 triples, 100 home runs and 483 RBI in 82 games against teams from the American League West division. The Tigers lead all American League clubs during that stretch with a .285 batting average, 34 triples, a .362 on-base percentage and a .465 slugging percentage, while ranking fourth with 100 home runs. The Tigers also lead with 6.11 runs per game against the West.

CRAZY EIGHTS: The Tigers finished last night's game against the Angels with 18 hits and have now collected at least eight hits in each of the season's first 14 games. It is the longest such streak in the majors this season and the longest by a Tigers team to begin the season since at least 1954.

BASES LOADED BONANZA: Tigers hitters are batting .522 (12x23) with three doubles, a home run and 29 RBI with the bases loaded this season. The Tigers lead the American League with 29 RBI, while they are second with the .522 batting average and fourth with an .783 slugging percentage. Miguel Cabrera leads all active players with a .444 batting average (36x81) with the bases loaded during his career, while Carlos Guillen ranks fourth with a .414 batting average (46x111).

WILLIS' REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Dontrelle Willis began an injury rehabilitation assignment on Tuesday night with Single A Lakeland, working seven innings and allowing four runs on eight hits to take the loss against Clearwater at Joker Marchant Stadium. Willis struck out two and did not issue a walk during the outing. His rehabilitation assignment was transferred to Double A Erie yesterday and he is scheduled to make his next start with the SeaWolves on Sunday against Harrisburg. Willis has been on the disabled list since March 29 with anxiety disorder.

ZUMAYA'S INJURY REHAB ASSIGNMENT RUNDOWN: Joel Zumaya continued his injury rehabilitation assignment with Triple A Toledo last night, tossing a scoreless inning and striking out two against Indianapolis. Zumaya has tossed four scoreless innings in three outings with the Mud Hens, allowing two hits and striking out five batters. Zumaya allowed five runs (three earned) on three hits, while walking five and striking out four in 2.1 innings of work in two outings with Single A Lakeland. He has been on the disabled list since March 27 with a sore right shoulder.

E.J.'S EDICT: In his first season with the Tigers, Jackson will make his fourth start of the season this evening against the Angels.

CAREER-BEST WIN TOTAL: Jackson won a career-high 14 games for Tampa Bay in 2008, tying the club record in a single season.

LIMITING THE HITTING: Jackson has limited opponents to a .164 batting average (12x73) this season, second among all American League pitchers. He has limited lefthanded hitters to a .100 batting average (3x30), which ranks second among all American League starting pitchers.

RECORD AT ANGEL STADIUM: Jackson is making his sixth career appearance and fifth career start at Angel Stadium this evening. He has posted a 1-2 record and 5.66 ERA (20.2IP/13ER) in his previous five outings at Angel Stadium.

BETTER AS HE GOES: Opponents are hitting .293 (412x1406) the first two times through the lineup against Jackson during his career, while they are hitting .249 (115x462) the third and fourth times through the lineup against him.

AT HIS BEST AGAINST THE WEST: Jackson has posted a 3.51 ERA (84.2IP/33ER) with 61 strikeouts in 16 career appearances against teams from the American League West division.

INDUCING THE DOUBLE PLAY: Jackson tied for fifth in the American League by inducing opponents to ground into a double play 27 times during the 2008 season. He finished third in the league with 1.33 ground into double plays per nine innings last season.

GERMAN BORN: Jackson is just the second pitcher in Tigers history to be born in Germany. He joins Bun Troy, who started one game for the Tigers during the 1912 season.

OCTOBER EXPERIENCE: Jackson saw action in three games for Tampa Bay during the post-season in 2008, fanning five batters as he posted a 2.08 ERA (4.1IP/1ER).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Jackson was acquired by the Tigers in a two-player deal with the Tampa Bay Rays on December 11, 2008. He was originally selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the sixth round of the June 2001 draft.
