**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers suffered an 8-6 loss to the New York Yankees on Wednesday night at Comerica Park. Rick Porcello (1-3) took the loss for Detroit after allowing six runs in 3.2 innings of work. Curtis Granderson belted a three-run home run for the Tigers, while Brandon Inge added a double and an RBI. The Tigers continue an eight-game homestand with the first game of a three-game series against the Cleveland Indians this evening. Detroit concludes the homestand with a two-game series with the Minnesota Twins beginning on Monday.

**CENTRAL FOCUS:** Tonight marks the first game of a stretch in which the Tigers play 13 consecutive games against rivals from the American League's Central Division.

**GUILLEN GETS GOING AGAINST TRIBE:** Since joining the Tigers in 2004, Carlos Guillen is hitting .339 (85x251) with 17 doubles, two triples, nine home runs and 36 RBI in 66 games against the Cleveland Indians. He is 10th among all active major league players with a .339 batting average against the Indians.

**CABRERA CLUBS CLEVELAND:** Miguel Cabrera enters tonight's game versus Cleveland hitting .303 (30x99) with five doubles, 10 home runs and 25 RBI in 24 games during his career against the club. Since 2004, he is third among all active major league players with a .657 slugging percentage against the Indians. Cabrera batted .316 (25x79) with eight home runs and 23 RBI in 18 games against Cleveland in 2008. He topped all major league players with eight home runs and 23 RBI last season versus the Indians.

**BRANDON'S BEEN ON BASE:** Brandon Inge has reached base safely in 21 consecutive games to begin the season. The 21-game streak is the longest such streak by a Tigers player to begin the season since Inge also reached base safely in 21 consecutive games to begin the 2005 season from April 4-29, 2005. Prior to Inge's two streaks, the longest such streak was posted by Alan Trammell. Trammell reached base safely in 22 consecutive games April 9-May 2 to open the 1990 season.

**POLANCO DOUBLING UP IN THE EARLY GOING:** Placido Polanco legged out a double on Tuesday night against the Yankees and is now second in the American League with 10 doubles this season. His 10 doubles in the month of April tied with Curtis Granderson (2007) for second-most by a Tigers player in the season's opening month since at least 1954. Magglio Ordonez (13 in 2007) is the only Tigers players since at least 1954 to collect more than 10 doubles in April.

**ORDONEZ ON FIRE AT HOME:** Since the start of the 2007 season, Magglio Ordonez is batting .363 (212x584) with 108 runs scored, 51 doubles, 31 home runs and 133 RBI in 158 games at Comerica Park. He leads all American League players with the .363 batting average, while he is second with a .429 on-base percentage and .610 slugging percentage, tied for second with 133 RBI and third with the 51 doubles.

**FOR STARTERS:** Over the team's last 11 games, Tigers starting pitchers have combined for a 5-3 record and 3.69 ERA (63.1IP/26ER). Tigers starting pitchers have compiled an 8-7 record and 4.43 ERA (120.0IP/59ER) through the club's first 21 games of the season. Tigers starting pitchers are fourth in the American League with a 4.43 ERA and a .257 batting average against (120x467). Additionally, club starting pitchers have issued 42 walks, fifth-fewest in the league.

**RISP MANAGEMENT:** Since April 10, the Tigers are hitting .311 (47x151) with runners in scoring position. For the season, the club is hitting .298 (51x171) with runners in scoring position, fourth-best in the American League. Miguel Cabrera is third in the league with a .471 batting average (8x17) with runners in scoring position.

**ANDERSON'S OFFENSIVE IMPACT:** Josh Anderson singled on Wednesday night against the Yankees and has hit safely in nine of his last 12 games. Anderson is batting .400 (14x35) with eight runs scored, three doubles, a triple, six RBI and six stolen bases during that stretch. He is sixth in the American League with six stolen bases this season.

**WILLIS' REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP:** Dontrelle Willis had his injury rehabilitation assignment transferred to Triple A Toledo on Monday and he is scheduled to start for the Mud Hens this evening at Lehigh Valley. He worked six innings with Double A Erie on April 26 against Harrisburg, allowing two runs on three hits, while walking three and striking out six to earn the victory. He began the injury rehab assignment on April 21 with Single A Lakeland, working seven innings and allowing four runs on eight hits to take the loss against Clearwater. Willis struck out two and did not issue a walk during the outing. Willis has been on the disabled list since March 29 with anxiety disorder.

## TONIGHT'S TIGERS STARTER - ARMANDO GALARRAGA

**ARMANDO'S ANTIDOTE:** In his second season with the Tigers, Galarraga is making his fifth start of the 2009 season this evening against the Indians.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Galarraga is second among all American League pitchers with a 1.85 ERA this season, while he is tied for fourth with three wins, eighth with a .218 batting average against and ninth with 8.9 strikeouts per nine innings.

**TAMING THE TRIBE:** Galarraga has recorded a quality start in three of his five career starts against the Indians, including in his first major league win on April 16, 2008 at Progressive Field over Cleveland. He tied for the lead among all major league pitchers with three wins against the Indians during the 2008 season.

**HOME COOKIN':** Galarraga is making his third start of the season at home this evening against the Indians. In his previous two starts, he is 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA (13.1IP/1ER). Galarraga is second among American League pitchers with a 0.68 ERA at home.

**RECORD AT COMERICA PARK:** Galarraga is making his 16th career start at Comerica Park this evening. In his previous 15 starts, he is 7-3 with a 3.68 ERA (93.0IP/38ER).

**LIMITING THE HITTING:** Since the start of the 2008 season, Galarraga is third among all American League pitchers with a .225 batting average against, while he is fourth with 7.58 hits allowed per nine innings.

**ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES:** Galarraga has limited righthanded batters to a .178 batting average (8x45) this season, sixth-best among all American League pitchers. In his major league career, he has held righthanded batters to a .176 batting average (63x357).

**CENTRAL FOCUS:** Galarraga is making his third start of the season against an opponent from the American League's Central Division this evening. In his previous two outings, he is 2-0 with a 0.73 ERA (12.1IP/1ER). During his career, Galarraga is 6-5 with a 3.65 ERA (91.1IP/37ER) in 16 outings (14 starts) against clubs from the American League's Central Division.

**RISP MANAGEMENT:** During his major league career, Galarraga has limited opponents to a .229 batting average (35x153) when hitting with runners in scoring position. Opponents are hitting .211 (4x19) against him with runners in scoring position in 2009.

**ROOKIE LEADER:** Galarraga topped all American League rookie pitchers with 13 wins and 126 strikeouts for the Tigers during the 2008 season, while he finished third with a 3.73 ERA.

**WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC PARTICIPANT:** Galarraga started two games for Venezuela during the World Baseball Classic this spring. In his two starts, he finished 1-0 with a 4.91 ERA (7.1IP/4ER) and six strikeouts.

**OPENING DAY FIRST:** Galarraga made the Tigers Opening Day roster, marking the first time he has been on an Opening Day roster at the major league level.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Galarraga was acquired by the Tigers from the Texas Rangers in a two-player deal on February 4, 2008. He originally signed with the Montreal Expos as a non-drafted free agent on October 31, 1998.
