**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers suffered a 14-10 loss in 13 innings last night to Minnesota. Brandon Lyon (1-3) allowed five runs in relief to take the loss for Detroit. Miguel Cabrera, Jeff Larish and Brandon Inge all homered for the Tigers. The Tigers conclude the club's seven-game road trip this afternoon with the final game of a three-game series at Minnesota against the Twins. Following this afternoon's game, the club returns home for a nine-game homestand with Oakland, Texas and Colorado.

**ROBERTSON PLACED ON DL, FRENCH'S CONTRACT PURCHASED:** The Tigers today announced the club has placed lefthanded pitcher Nate Robertson on the 15-day disabled list retroactive to May 6 with a low back muscle strain. To take Robertson's place on the club's 25-man roster, the Tigers today purchased the contract of lefthanded pitcher Luke French from Triple A Toledo. In six starts with the Mud Hens, French posted a 2-2 record, 2.91 ERA (34.0IP/11ER) and 29 strikeouts.

**METRODOME VICTORIES:** Since the start of the 2007 season, the Tigers have compiled an 11-9 record against the Twins at the Metrodome. The 11 wins during that stretch are the most in the majors by a visiting club at the Metrodome.

**MAGGIO MASHES AGAINST MINNESOTA:** Magglio Ordonez enters today's game against Minnesota hitting .325 (197x606) with 40 doubles, 34 home runs and 122 RBI in 160 games versus the club. He is ninth among all active major league players with a .566 slugging percentage against the Twins, while he is 12th with his .325 batting average. Additionally, he is batting .323 (95x294) with 16 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs and 63 RBI in 75 games at the Metrodome during his career. Ordonez is seventh among all active major league players with a .323 batting average at the Metrodome, while he is eighth with a .524 slugging percentage.

**GRANDY SLUGS VERSUS THE TWINS:** Curtis Granderson is batting .299 (73x244) with 15 doubles, six triples, 14 home runs and 34 RBI in 67 games during his career against the Minnesota Twins. He enters today's game sixth among all active major league players with a .582 slugging percentage versus the Twins. Granderson is hitting .331 (40x121) with eight doubles, two triples, seven home runs and 16 RBI in 33 games during his career at the Metrodome. He is fourth among all active major league players with a .331 batting average at the Metrodome, while he is fifth with a .603 slugging percentage.

**GRANDY GOES YARD AGAINST BAKER:** Curtis Granderson enters this afternoon's game at Minnesota with four home runs during his career against Scott Baker, tied for the most against the pitcher along with Cleveland's Travis Hafner. Granderson has compiled a .706 slugging percentage against Baker, while batting .265 (9x34).

**DAYTIME DELIGHT:** The Tigers enter this afternoon's contest at Minnesota with a 9-2 record in the club's 11 day games thus far in 2009. The team is hitting .302 (112x371) with 70 runs scored, 18 doubles, three triples and 11 home runs in 11 games during the day this season. The Tigers are tops among all American League clubs with a .302 batting average in day games this season.

**HOMERING IN THE METRODOME:** The Tigers clubbed three home runs last night against the Twins in the Metrodome. The Tigers have homered in 11 of the club's 12 games at the park dating back to September 16, 2007, for a total of 18 home runs. The Tigers have connected for 12 home runs over the team's last five games at the Metrodome.

**NOT SHORT ON PRODUCTION:** Through the club's first 32 games of the season, Adam Everett and Ramon Santiago have combined to hit .288 (32x111) with seven doubles, three home runs and 28 RBI at shortstop for the Tigers. The Tigers are tops among all American League clubs with 28 RBI from the shortstop position this season.

**PROFICIENT IN THE FIELD:** Over the club's last 16 games dating back to April 25, the Tigers have compiled a .989 fielding percentage (612TC/7E). The Tigers have committed 18 errors this season, tied for second-fewest among all American League clubs.

**EXTRA BASES, GRANDY STYLE:** Since the start of the 2007 season, Curtis Granderson is tops among all American League players with 158 extra-base hits. Additionally, he is tops among all league players with 46 triples since the start of the 2006 season.

**BONDERMAN TO START INJURY REHAB ASSIGNMENT:** Jeremy Bonderman is slated to join Single A West Michigan to begin an injury rehabilitation assignment on Saturday. He is scheduled to start that evening versus Great Lakes. Bonderman has been sidelined since March 30 as he continues to recover from thoracic outlet compression syndrome surgery.

## TODAY'S TIGERS STARTER - JUSTIN VERLANDER

'09 Season (Detroit): 3-2, 4.50 ERA, 7 G, 7 GS, 1 CG, 1 SHO, 0 SV, 44.0 IP, 38 H, 25 R, 22 ER, 14 BB, 56 SO.

'08 Season (Detroit): 11-17, 4.84 ERA, 33 G, 33 GS, 1 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 201.0 IP, 195 H, 119 R, 108 ER, 87 BB, 163 SO.

**JUSTIN'S CASE:** In his fourth full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his eighth start of the season today against the Twins.

**LOOKING AT THE LEADER BOARDS:** Verlander enters his start this afternoon versus the Twins tops among all American League pitchers with 11.5 strikeouts per nine innings, while he is second with 56 strikeouts and fifth with 4.00 strikeouts per walk.

**AMONG THE AL BEST SINCE 2006:** Verlander enters his start this afternoon against the Twins third among American League pitchers with 49 wins since the start of the 2006 season, while he is fourth with 102 starts and 632.2 innings pitched and tied for eighth with 526 strikeouts.

**GREAT IN THREE STRAIGHT:** Verlander fired a two-hit shutout as he matched a season high with 11 strikeouts on May 8 at Cleveland. He has won each of his last three starts, compiling a 0.39 ERA (23.0IP/1ER) and 31 strikeouts. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Verlander is the first pitcher in Tigers history to win three consecutive starts while allowing only one run and fanning 30-or-more batters.

**RING 'EM UP:** Verlander matched a season high with 11 strikeouts on May 8 at Cleveland, his second straight start with 11 strikeouts. He is the first Tigers pitcher since Jeremy Bonderman to fan 10-or-more batters in consecutive starts. Bonderman accomplished the feat in 2006, fanning 12 batters on both June 14 versus Tampa Bay and June 19 at Milwaukee. Verlander has fanned 10-or-more batters in a start six times during his major league career.

**GOING THE DISTANCE:** Verlander tossed his fourth career complete game and third career shutout on May 8 at Cleveland. He became the first Tigers pitcher to fire a shutout since he did so on June 12, 2007 versus Milwaukee. Verlander was the first Tigers pitcher to toss a complete game since he also did so on June 11, 2008 versus the Chicago White Sox.

**MR. MAY:** Verlander is 2-0 with a 0.56 ERA (16.0IP/1ER) and 22 strikeouts in two starts during May this season. During his career, he is 11-6 with a 2.90 ERA (130.1IP/42ER) in 19 starts during the month.

**RECORD AT METRODOME:** Verlander is making his fourth career start at the Metrodome this afternoon. In his previous three outings, he is 1-1 with a 4.12 ERA (19.2IP/9ER).

**ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES:** Verlander has limited righthanded batters to a .191 batting average (13x68) this season, while lefthanded batters are hitting .253 (25x99) against him. He is 11th among all American League pitchers with a .191 batting average against righthanded batters.

**MORE PITCHES:** Verlander is fifth among all American League pitchers with 103.9 pitches per game since the beginning of the 2006 season. He finished second in the league with 106.9 pitches per game in 2008.

**NO WALKS:** Verlander did not issue a walk in his start on April 27 versus the New York Yankees. It marked the first time he did not walk a batter in a start since June 11, 2008 versus the Chicago White Sox, a stretch of 23 starts in which he issued at least one walk. It marked the 11th time in his career he did not walk a batter in a start.

**PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS:** Verlander fanned 34 batters in his five starts during April for the Tigers, marking the most strikeouts by a club pitcher in the season's opening month since Hideo Nomo fanned 35 batters in 2000. Verlander's 34 strikeouts tied for fourth-most by a Tigers pitcher in the season's opening month since at least 1954.

**TURN OF THE CENTURY:** Verlander made the 100th start of his major league career on April 17 at Seattle. He became the 54th pitcher in Tigers history to start 100 games.

**OPENING DAY NOD:** Verlander made his second career Opening Day start on April 6 against the Toronto Blue Jays. He became the first Tigers pitcher to start consecutive Opening Days since Jeff Weaver did so in both 2001 and 2002. Verlander did not factor in the decision in his start on Opening Day on March 31, 2008 versus the Kansas City Royals.

**NO-NO:** Verlander fired the first no-hitter in Comerica Park history on June 12, 2007 versus Milwaukee, the sixth no-hitter in Tigers history. It was the first no-hitter by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris on April 7, 1984 against the Chicago White Sox at Comiskey Park. Verlander became the first Tigers pitcher to toss a no-hitter in Detroit since Virgil Trucks on May 15, 1952 versus Washington at Briggs Stadium.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad for the first time in 2007. Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006.
