RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers knocked off the Oakland Athletics 14-1 last night at Comerica Park. Edwin Jackson (3-2) limited Oakland to one run over seven innings of work to earn the win for Detroit. Ryan Raburn and Brandon Inge both belted grand slams for Detroit, as both players collected five RBI. Magglio Ordonez added three hits and two RBI for Detroit. The Tigers continue a nine-game homestand this evening with the second game of a three-game series against the Athletics. Following an off day on Monday, the homestand continues with a three-game series against both the Texas Rangers and Colorado Rockies.

HOME IS WHERE THE MOUND IS: In 14 games at Comerica Park this season, Tigers pitchers have compiled a 3.36 ERA (126.0IP/47ER). The Tigers lead all American League clubs with a 3.36 ERA at home this season, while the club is second with a .238 batting average against (114x478). The Tigers are fourth in the American League with a 4.17 ERA this season.

ON THE OFFENSIVE AGAINST THE WEST: The Tigers enter tonight's game against Oakland with a .309 batting average (109x353) in 10 games against clubs from the American League's West Division this season. The Tigers have scored 72 runs during the nine games, while the club has collected 17 doubles, a triple and 10 home runs.

POLANCO PACKS A PUNCH AGAINST A'S: Placido Polanco is tops among all major league players with a .389 batting average (51x131) in 32 games against Oakland since the start of the 2005 season. During his career, he is hitting .392 (56x143) with eight doubles, two home runs and 18 RBI in 35 games against the club. Polanco was selected the Most Valuable Player of the 2006 American League Championship Series after batting .529 (9x17) in four games versus Oakland.

GRAND SLAMS, BETTER IN PAIRS: Ryan Raburn and Brandon Inge both connected for grand slams last night versus Oakland, marking just the third time in Tigers history the club has belted two grand slams in a game. Both Ray Boone and Al Kaline hit a grand slam on June 11, 1954 at Philadelphia and Jim Northrup connected for two grand slams on June 24, 1968.

INGE SLAMS AT COMERICA: Brandon Inge belted his fourth career grand slam last night versus Oakland. All four of his grand slams during his career have been hit at Comerica Park, tying him with Marcus Thames for the most grand slams hit by a player in the 10-year history of the ballpark.

FOR STARTERS: Tigers starting pitchers enter tonight's game versus Oakland leading the American League with 175 strikeouts, a .248 batting average against (189x763), 8.48 hits per nine innings and 7.85 strikeouts per nine innings. Additionally, club starters are second in the league with 11.89 baserunners per nine innings and third with a 3.99 ERA (200.2IP/89ER).

BASES LOADED BONANZA: Ryan Raburn and Brandon Inge both belted grand slams last night versus Oakland, Detroit's third and fourth grand slams of the season. The Tigers are tops among all American League clubs with a .500 batting average (18x36) when hitting with the bases loaded this season. Detroit is leading all league clubs with four grand slams and 52 RBI with the bases loaded.

NOT SHORT ON PRODUCTION: Through the club's first 34 games of the season, Adam Everett and Ramon Santiago have combined to hit .286 (34x119) with seven doubles, three home runs and 29 RBI at shortstop for the Tigers. The Tigers are tops among all American League clubs with 29 RBI from the shortstop position this season.

PROFICIENT IN THE FIELD: Over the club's last 18 games dating back to April 25, the Tigers have compiled a .990 fielding percentage (673TC/7E). The Tigers have committed 18 errors this season, tied for second-fewest among all American League clubs.

BONDERMAN TO START INJURY REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Jeremy Bonderman is slated to join Single A West Michigan to begin an injury rehabilitation assignment today. He is scheduled to start this evening versus Great Lakes. He has been sidelined since March 30 as he continues to recover from thoracic outlet compression syndrome surgery.

TONIGHT'S TIGERS STARTER - RICK PORCELLO

PORCELLO'S PROGNOSIS: In his first season with the Tigers, Porcello will make his seventh start of the 2009 season tonight against the Oakland Athletics.

ROOKIE IN THE ROTATION: Porcello is the first rookie to begin the season in the Tigers starting rotation since Justin Verlander did so in 2006.

TERRIFIC IN HIS LAST TWO STARTS: Porcello has won both of his last two starts for the Tigers, posting a 0.75 ERA (12.0IP/1ER).

GETTING THE GROUND BALL: Porcello has posted a 2.18 ground ball/fly ball ratio (61 ground balls/28 fly balls) for the Tigers in 2009, fourth-best in the American League.

ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES: Porcello has limited righthanded batters to a .211 batting average (12x57) in six starts thus far with the Tigers. Lefthanded batters are hitting .292 (21x72) against Porcello.

RECORD AT COMERICA PARK: Porcello is making his third career start at Comerica Park this evening. In his previous two outings, he is 1-1 with a 5.06 ERA (10.2IP/6ER).

FRESH FACE AT COMERICA PARK: Porcello became the youngest Tigers pitcher to start a game at Comerica Park at 20 years, four months and 2 days, doing so on April 29 versus the New York Yankees. He became the third-youngest pitcher to start a game at Comerica Park, joining Seattle's Felix Hernandez, who took the mound for the Mariners on August 4, 2005 at 19 years, three months, and 26 days, and Los Angeles' Clayton Kershaw, who took the mound for the Dodgers on June 15, 2008 at 20 years, two months and 27 days.

NICE WIN, KID: Porcello earned his first major league victory in his start on April 19 at Seattle. At 20 years, three months and 23 days, he became the youngest Tigers pitcher to record a victory since Bruce Robbins recorded a victory on August 28, 1979 at 19 years, 11 months and 28 days.

YOUNGSTER IN HIS DEBUT: Porcello made his major league debut on April 9 at Toronto at 20 years, three months and 13 days, becoming the youngest Tigers pitcher to start a game in his major league debut for the club since Bruce Robbins was 19 years old in his debut on July 28, 1979. Jeremy Bonderman was 20 years, five months and five days old when he made his major league debut for the Tigers on April 2, 2003 versus Minnesota.

IT'S A FIRST: Porcello made his major league debut on April 9 against the Blue Jays, opposing Toronto's Ricky Romero, who also made his major league debut. According to the Elias Sports Bureau and the Canadian Press, it marked the first time since the MLB Draft began in 1965 that two first-round selections making their major league debut squared off against each other.

A FIRST WITH A TIGERS TWIST: Porcello and Toronto's Ricky Romero made their major league debuts on April 9 in Toronto, marking the first time the Tigers have been involved in a such a matchup since August 8, 2001 at Texas when Nate Cornejo made his major league debut against Joaquin Benoit of the Rangers. Cornejo did not factor in the decision as the Tigers scored 13 runs in the top of the ninth inning to break a 6-6 tie and defeat the Rangers 19-6. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last time two pitchers making their major league debut faced each other was September 4, 2008 when Washington's Shairon Martis opposed Atlanta's James Parr.

FLORIDA STATE LEAGUE LEADER: Porcello led the Florida State League with a 2.66 ERA as he was selected to the league's mid- and post-season all-star squads in his first professional season in 2008. Additionally, he tied for second among all league starters with a .244 batting average against.

PROSPECT STATUS: Porcello was tabbed the 21st-best prospect in baseball prior to the start of the 2009 season by *Baseball America*. Additionally, he was named the top prospect in both the Tigers organization and Florida State League following the 2008 season by the publication.
