**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers dropped their third straight game last night, falling 6-5 to the Cleveland Indians at Comerica Park. Armando Galarraga (3-1) allowed five runs in five innings of work to take the loss for the Tigers. Miguel Cabrera belted a three-run home run for the Tigers, while Adam Everett added a run-scoring double. The Tigers continue an eight-game homestand with the second game of a three-game series against the Indians this afternoon. Detroit concludes the homestand with a two-game series with the Minnesota Twins beginning on Monday.

**INGE, GALARRAGA EARN APRIL HONORS:** Brandon Inge and Armando Galarraga were selected the Tigers Player and Pitcher of the Month, respectively, for April. Inge hit .319 (22x69) with three doubles, seven home runs and 18 RBI in 21 games during the month. Inge tied for fourth in the American League with seven home runs during the month. Galarraga compiled a 3-0 record and 1.85 ERA (24.1IP/5ER) in four starts during April.

**TREANOR UPDATE:** Matt Treanor underwent surgery on his right hip to remove a bone spur that was causing inflammation on Thursday. The procedure was performed by Dr. Bryan Kelly at the Hospital for Special Surgery in New York and it most likely will put Treanor out for the remainder of the season.

**CENTRAL FOCUS:** Today's game marks the second game of a stretch in which the Tigers play 13 consecutive games against rivals from the American League's Central Division.

**GUILLEN GETS GOING AGAINST TRIBE:** Since joining the Tigers in 2004, Carlos Guillen is hitting .333 (85x255) with 17 doubles, two triples, nine home runs and 36 RBI in 67 games against the Cleveland Indians. He is tied for 11th among all active major league players with a .333 batting average against the Indians.

**CABRERA CLUBS CLEVELAND:** Miguel Cabrera enters today's game versus Cleveland hitting .311 (32x103) with five doubles, 11 home runs and 28 RBI in 25 games during his career against the club. Since 2004, he is third among all active major league players with a .680 slugging percentage against the Indians. Cabrera batted .316 (25x79) with eight home runs and 23 RBI in 18 games against Cleveland in 2008. He topped all major league players with eight home runs and 23 RBI last season versus the Indians.

**BRANDON'S BEEN ON BASE:** Brandon Inge has reached base safely in 22 consecutive games to begin the season. The 22-game streak is the longest such streak by a Tigers player to begin the season since Alan Trammell also reached base safely in 22 consecutive games April 9-May 2 to open the 1990 season. Prior to Inge's and Trammell's streaks, the longest such streak was posted by Ron LeFlore. LeFlore reached base safely in 30 consecutive games April 17-May 27 to open the 1976 season.

**ORDONEZ ON FIRE AT HOME:** Since the start of the 2007 season, Magglio Ordonez is batting .362 (213x588) with 108 runs scored, 51 doubles, 31 home runs and 133 RBI in 159 games at Comerica Park. He leads all American League players with the .362 batting average, while he is second with a .428 on-base percentage and .607 slugging percentage, tied for second with 133 RBI and third with the 51 doubles.

**RISP MANAGEMENT:** Since April 10, the Tigers are hitting .321 (51x159) with runners in scoring position. For the season, the club is hitting .307 (55x179) with runners in scoring position, second-best in the American League. Miguel Cabrera is tops in the league with a .500 batting average (9x18) with runners in scoring position.

**EXTRA BASES, GRANDY STYLE:** Since the start of the 2007 season, Curtis Granderson is tied for the lead among all American League players with 153 extra-base hits. New York's Alex Rodriguez and Toronto's Alex Rios have collected 153 extra-base hits during that stretch as well.

**WILLIS' REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP:** Dontrelle Willis had his injury rehabilitation assignment transferred to Triple A Toledo on Monday and he started for the Mud Hens last night at Lehigh Valley. Willis did not figure in the decision last night as he allowed three runs on seven hits in five innings of work, while he issued two walks and fanned four batters. He worked six innings with Double A Erie on April 26 against Harrisburg, allowing two runs on three hits, while walking three and striking out six to earn the victory. He began the injury rehab assignment on April 21 with Single A Lakeland, working seven innings and allowing four runs on eight hits to take the loss against Clearwater. Willis struck out two and did not issue a walk during the outing. Willis has been on the disabled list since March 29 with anxiety disorder.

**FIRST START AGAINST THE TRIBE:** Miner is making his first career start against the Indians this afternoon. Cleveland is the last team (other than Detroit) he had not started against in the American League's Central Division.

**RECORD AT COMERICA PARK:** Miner is making his 55th career appearance, 19th start, at Comerica Park this afternoon. In his previous 54 outings, he is 9-8 with a 5.68 ERA (136.1IP/86ER).

**TOUGHER ON THE LEFTIES:** Miner has limited lefthanded batters to a .208 batting average (5x24) this season, while righthanded batters are hitting .400 (14x35) against him.

**GETTING THE GROUND BALL:** Miner has posted a 3.30 ground ball/fly ball ratio (33 ground ball outs/10 fly ball outs) for the Tigers in 2009. During his career, he has posted a 1.70 ground ball/fly ball ratio (445 ground ball outs/261 fly ball outs).

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Miner was acquired by the Tigers from the Braves in a three-player deal on July 31, 2005. He was originally signed by the Braves after the club selected him in the fourth round of the 2000 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
