**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers knocked off the Cleveland Indians 9-7 yesterday afternoon at Comerica Park. Joel Zumaya (1-0) earned the win in relief for Detroit, while Fernando Rodney recorded his fifth save of the season. Adam Everett belted a grand slam for the Tigers, while Curtis Granderson added a two-run home run. The Tigers continue an eight-game homestand with the final game of a three-game series against the Indians this afternoon. Detroit concludes the homestand with a two-game series with the Minnesota Twins beginning tomorrow night.

**CENTRAL FOCUS:** Today's game marks the third game of a stretch in which the Tigers play 13 consecutive games against rivals from the American League's Central Division.

**GUILLEN GETS GOING AGAINST TRIBE:** Since joining the Tigers in 2004, Carlos Guillen is hitting .328 (85x259) with 17 doubles, two triples, nine home runs and 36 RBI in 68 games against the Cleveland Indians. He is 15th among all active major league players with a .328 batting average against the Indians.

**CABRERA CLUBS CLEVELAND:** Miguel Cabrera enters today's game versus Cleveland hitting .308 (33x107) with five doubles, 11 home runs and 28 RBI in 26 games during his career against the club. Since 2004, he is third among all active major league players with a .664 slugging percentage against the Indians. Cabrera batted .316 (25x79) with eight home runs and 23 RBI in 18 games against Cleveland in 2008. He topped all major league players with eight home runs and 23 RBI last season versus the Indians.

**LOCKED IN ON LEE:** Brandon Inge enters today's game hitting .400 (12x30) during his career against Cliff Lee, while Magglio Ordonez is batting .359 (14x39) versus Cleveland's starter. Among all active major league players with at least 30 plate appearances against Lee, Inge is tops with his .400 batting average and Ordonez is fourth with his .359 batting average.

**BRANDON'S BEEN ON BASE:** Brandon Inge has reached base safely in 23 consecutive games to begin the season. The 23-game streak is the longest such streak by a Tigers player to begin the season since Ron LeFlore reached base safely in 30 consecutive games April 17-May 27 to open the 1976 season. Inge is sixth among American League players with a .441 on-base percentage.

**ORDONEZ ON FIRE AT HOME:** Since the start of the 2007 season, Magglio Ordonez is batting .361 (214x592) with 108 runs scored, 51 doubles, 31 home runs and 134 RBI in 160 games at Comerica Park. He leads all American League players with the .361 batting average, while he is second with a .428 on-base percentage and third with the 51 doubles, 134 RBI and a .605 slugging percentage.

**RISP MANAGEMENT:** Since April 10, the Tigers are hitting .323 (54x167) with runners in scoring position. For the season, the club is hitting .310 (58x187) with runners in scoring position, second-best in the American League. Miguel Cabrera is tied for second in the league with a .450 batting average (9x20) with runners in scoring position.

**BASES LOADED BONANZA:** Adam Everett connected for the club's second grand slam of the season yesterday afternoon versus Cleveland. The Tigers are second among American League clubs with a .500 batting average (14x28) when hitting with the bases loaded this season.

**EXTRA BASES, GRANDY STYLE:** Since the start of the 2007 season, Curtis Granderson is leading all American League players with 154 extra-base hits. New York's Alex Rodriguez and Toronto's Alex Rios are tied for second with 153 extra-base hits during that stretch.

**WILLIS' INJURY REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP:** Dontrelle Willis is currently with Triple A Toledo as part of his injury rehabilitation assignment. Here is a complete recap of his injury rehabilitation assignment thus far:

- He is slated to make another start with the Mud Hens on Wednesday at Pawtucket.
- Willis had his injury rehabilitation assignment transferred to Toledo on Monday and he started for the Mud Hens on Friday night at Lehigh Valley. Willis did not figure in the decision on Friday night as he allowed three runs on seven hits in five innings of work, while he issued two walks and fanned four batters.
- He worked six innings with Double A Erie on April 26 against Harrisburg, allowing two runs on three hits, while walking three and striking out six to earn the victory.
- He began the injury rehab assignment on April 21 with Single A Lakeland, working seven innings and allowing four runs on eight hits to take the loss against Clearwater. Willis struck out two and did not issue a walk during the outing.

## TODAY'S TIGERS STARTER - JUSTIN VERLANDER

'09 Season (Detroit): 1-2, 6.75 ERA, 5 G, 5 GS, 0 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 28.0 IP, 34 H, 24 R, 21 ER, 9 BB, 34 SO.

'08 Season (Detroit): 11-17, 4.84 ERA, 33 G, 33 GS, 1 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 201.0 IP, 195 H, 119 R, 108 ER, 87 BB, 163 SO.

**JUSTIN'S CASE:** In his fourth full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his sixth start of the season today against the Indians.

**LOOKING AT THE LEADER BOARDS:** Verlander enters his start this afternoon versus the Indians second among all American League pitchers with 10.9 strikeouts per nine innings, while he is tied for fourth with 34 strikeouts.

**AMONG THE AL BEST SINCE 2006:** Verlander enters his start today against the Indians third among American League pitchers with 47 wins since the start of the 2006 season, while he is fourth with 100 starts, fifth with 616.2 innings pitched and ninth with 504 strikeouts.

**WINNING AT HOME:** Verlander is second among all active American League pitchers with 26 wins at home since the start of the 2006 season. He has compiled a 26-14 record in his 51 starts at home during the stretch, a .650 winning percentage. Only Toronto's Roy Halladay (30) has posted more wins at home during the stretch.

**HOME COOKIN':** Verlander is making his third start at home of the season this afternoon against the Indians. In his previous two outings, he is 1-0 with a 0.75 ERA (12.0IP/1ER). Verlander is second among all American League pitchers with a 0.75 ERA at home this season.

**NO WALKS:** Verlander did not issue a walk in his last start on April 27 versus the New York Yankees. It marked the first time he did not walk a batter in a start since June 11, 2008 versus the Chicago White Sox, a stretch of 23 starts in which he issued at least one walk. It marked the 11th time in his career he did not walk a batter in a start.

**RECORD AT COMERICA PARK:** Verlander is making his 53rd career start at Comerica Park this afternoon. In his previous 52 outings, he is 26-15 with a 3.96 ERA (316.0IP/139ER).

**PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS:** Verlander fanned 34 batters in his five starts during April for the Tigers, marking the most strikeouts by a club pitcher in the season's opening month since Hideo Nomo fanned 35 batters in 2000. Verlander's 34 strikeouts tied for fourth-most by a Tigers pitcher in the season's opening month since at least 1954.

**ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES:** Verlander has limited righthanded batters to a .235 batting average (12x51) this season, while left-handed batters are hitting .333 (22x66) against him.

**MORE PITCHES:** Verlander is seventh among all American League pitchers with 103.5 pitches per game since the beginning of the 2006 season. He finished second in the league with 106.9 pitches per game in 2008.

**TURN OF THE CENTURY:** Verlander made the 100th start of his major league career on April 17 at Seattle. He became the 54th pitcher in Tigers history to start 100 games.

**OPENING DAY NOD:** Verlander made his second career Opening Day start on April 6 against the Toronto Blue Jays. He became the first Tigers pitcher to start consecutive Opening Days since Jeff Weaver did so in both 2001 and 2002. Verlander did not factor in the decision in his start on Opening Day on March 31, 2008 versus the Kansas City Royals.

**NO-NO:** Verlander fired the first no-hitter in Comerica Park history on June 12, 2007 versus Milwaukee, the sixth no-hitter in Tigers history. It was the first no-hitter by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris on April 7, 1984 against the Chicago White Sox at Comiskey Park. Verlander became the first Tigers pitcher to toss a no-hitter in Detroit since Virgil Trucks on May 15, 1952 versus Washington at Briggs Stadium.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad for the first time in 2007. Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006.
