**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers suffered a 4-3 loss to the White Sox yesterday afternoon. Joel Zumaya (3-1) took the loss in relief for the Tigers. Curtis Granderson belted a two-run home run for Detroit, while Ramon Santiago added a solo shot. The Tigers continue an 11-game road trip with the first game of a three-game series at Pittsburgh this evening. The trip concludes with a three-game series in St. Louis starting on Tuesday night.

**ROSTER UPDATE:** The Tigers today announced the club has placed righthanded pitcher Jeremy Bonderman on the 15-day disabled list retroactive to June 9 as he continues his rehabilitation from thoracic outlet compression syndrome surgery performed on June 30, 2008. To take Bonderman's spot on the club's 25-man roster, the club today recalled the option of righthanded pitcher Ryan Perry. Perry was optioned to Toledo between games on Monday in Chicago, but he did not appear in a game with the Mud Hens before being recalled by the Tigers. Additionally, the Tigers today purchased the contract of infielder Don Kelly from Toledo. Kelly takes the spot of outfielder Clete Thomas on the club's roster, who had his contract optioned to Toledo following yesterday's game at Chicago.

**INTERLEAGUE HAPPENINGS:** Tonight's contest against the Pirates is Detroit's fourth game of interleague play in 2009. Since interleague play was started in 1997, the Tigers have compiled a 114-100 record. The Tigers are 51-33 in interleague games at Comerica Park. The Tigers are 1-2 during interleague action in 2009. Since the start of the 2006 season, Detroit has compiled a 43-14 record during interleague action.

**AMONG THE BEST SINCE 2006:** The Tigers have compiled a 43-14 record during interleague play since the start of the 2006 season. The 43 wins and .754 winning percentage during interleague action are second-best among all major league clubs during that stretch. The Minnesota Twins have compiled a 44-13 record and .772 winning percentage during that stretch, the only club better than the Tigers.

**PITCHING PROWESS DURING INTERLEAGUE:** Tigers pitchers have posted a 3.62 ERA (509.0IP/205ER) in 57 games during interleague action since the start of the 2006 season. The Tigers are second among all American League clubs with a 3.62 ERA during interleague play over that stretch. Club pitchers have limited National League opponents to a .257 batting average (497x1936) during the stretch.

**MAGGLIO MASHES DURING INTERLEAGUE ACTION:** Magglio Ordonez enters tonight's game at Pittsburgh hitting .341 (200x586) with 109 runs scored, 39 doubles, three triples, 32 home runs and 133 RBI in 158 games during his career in interleague play. He is second among all active major league players with a .341 batting average during interleague play, while he is eighth with a .582 slugging percentage.

**GRANDERSON GETTING IT GOING:** Curtis Granderson is batting .333 (23x69) with three doubles, a triple, three home runs and 11 RBI over his last 18 games. Since the start of the 2007 season, Granderson is tops among all American League players with 92 extra-base hits on the road, while he is second with a .549 slugging percentage.

**FOR STARTERS:** Tigers starting pitchers enter tonight's game against the Pirates leading the American League with a .248 batting average against and 8.36 hits per nine innings. They are second with a 3.91 ERA (356.1IP/155ER) and 11.92 baserunners per nine innings, while they are third with 280 strikeouts and 7.07 strikeouts per nine innings.

**QUANTITY OF QUALITY:** The Tigers have posted 19 quality starts over the club's last 27 games. Tigers starting pitchers have posted a 12-9 record and 3.67 ERA (169.0IP/69ER) during the stretch. Tigers starting pitchers are tied for fourth in the American League with 31 quality starts in 2009.

**MARCUS MASHES:** Marcus Thames has hit safely in all six of his games for the Tigers since being activated from the disabled list on June 7, hitting .368 (7x19). Since joining the Tigers in 2004, he has homered once every 14.28 at-bats (1242AB/87HR) in 410 games. Thames is fourth among all American League players with a minimum of 1,000 plate appearances since the start of the 2006 season with a home run once every 13.86 at-bats (970AB/70HR) in 311 games.

**BASES LOADED BONANZA:** Detroit is tops among all American League clubs with a .433 batting average (26x60) when hitting with the bases loaded this season. Detroit is leading all league clubs with five grand slams and 76 RBI with the bases loaded.

**PROFICIENT IN THE FIELD:** Over the club's last 28 games dating back to May 14, the Tigers have compiled a .992 fielding percentage (1029TC/8E). The Tigers have committed 26 errors this season, the third-fewest among all American League clubs.

**RADIO UPDATE:** Dan Dickerson has not been cleared to travel with the club following his injury, so FOX Sports Detroit pre-game show host John Keating will join Jim Price in the Tigers radio booth for all 11 games on the club's current road trip.

**INJURY UPDATE:** RHP **Jeremy Bonderman** (continued rehabilitation from thoracic outlet compression syndrome surgery, 15-day DL on June 9), OF **Carlos Guillen** (right shoulder inflammation, 15-day DL on May 5), C **Matt Treanor** (right hip strain, 60-day DL on April 24).

## TONIGHT'S TIGERS STARTER - RICK PORCELLO

'09 Season (Detroit): 6-4, 3.98 ERA, 11 G, 11 GS, 0 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 61.0 IP, 59 H, 28 R, 27 ER, 20 BB, 36 SO.

'08 Season (Lakeland): 8-6, 2.66 ERA, 24 G, 24 GS, 0 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 125.0 IP, 116 H, 51 R, 37 ER, 33 BB, 72 SO.

**PORCELLO'S PROGNOSIS:** In his first season with the Tigers, Porcello will make his 12th start of the 2009 season tonight against the Pirates.

**ROOKIE IN THE ROTATION:** Porcello is the first rookie to begin the season in the Tigers starting rotation since Justin Verlander did so in 2006.

**AMONG THE WINS LEADERS:** Porcello enters his start this evening against the Pirates tied for seventh among all American League pitchers with six wins.

**ROOKIE LEADER:** Porcello is tops among all American League rookies with six wins, while he is fourth with a 3.98 ERA and tied for seventh with 36 strikeouts.

**INTERLEAGUE ACTION:** Porcello is making his second career start during interleague play this evening against the Pirates. He won his previous outing during interleague action, limiting the Rockies to one run in six innings of work on May 22.

**GETTING THE GROUND BALL:** Porcello has posted a 2.20 ground ball/fly ball ratio (110 ground balls/50 fly balls) for the Tigers in 2009, third-best in the American League.

**ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES:** Porcello has limited righthanded batters to a .186 batting average (19x102) in 11 starts thus far with the Tigers, seventh-best in the American League. Lefthanded batters are hitting .308 (40x130) against Porcello.

**RECORD AT PNC PARK:** Porcello is making his first career start at PNC Park this evening.

**PORCELLO GARNERS AMERICAN LEAGUE ROOKIE HONORS:** Major League Baseball announced Rick Porcello was selected the American League's Rookie of the Month for May. He compiled a 5-0 record and 1.50 ERA (30.0IP/5ER) in five starts during the month for the Tigers. Porcello topped all league pitchers with a 1.50 ERA during the month, while he tied for the lead with five wins. He is the second Tigers pitcher to ever win the award, joining Justin Verlander. Verlander won the award in May of 2006.

**SUPER STREAK FOR A TIGERS YOUNGSTER:** Porcello recorded a victory in five straight outings May 5-27, establishing the longest winning streak by a Tigers pitcher age 20-or-younger since at least 1954.

**PORCELLO IN GOOD COMPANY:** Porcello posted a 1.50 ERA (30.0IP/5ER) as he earned the win each time out during a five-start stretch May 5-27. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Porcello, age 20 years, 151 days old, became the second-youngest pitcher in major league history to post a 5-0 record with an ERA of 1.50-or-better over any five-start span. Porcello joined Dwight Gooden, who went 5-0 with a 1.43 ERA over a five-start span at age 19 in 1984.

**WINNING STREAK PUTS PORCELLO IN SELECT GROUP OF YOUNG HURLERS:** Porcello recorded a victory in five straight outings May 5-27, becoming the fourth pitcher age 20-or-younger since at least 1954 to record a streak of five-or-more victories in a single season. Porcello joined Fernando Valenzuela (eight, April 9-May 14, 1981), Dwight Gooden (seven on two occasions, August 11-September 12, 1984 and July 9-August 10, 1985) and Wally Bunker (six, May 5-June 1, 1964).

**SPECIAL STREAK, SPECIAL COMPANY:** Rick Porcello earned the victory in four consecutive starts from May 5-22, allowing one run-or-fewer in each of the four starts. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Porcello is one of six pitchers since 1900 to win four straight starts while allowing one-or-fewer runs in a single season prior to turning 21 years old. Porcello joins Christy Mathewson (six straight in 1901 at age 20), Chief Bender (four straight in 1903 at age 19), Walter Johnson (five straight in 1908 at age 20), Fernando Valenzuela (seven straight in 1981 at age 20) and Kerry Wood (four straight in 1998 at age 20).

**NICE WIN, KID:** Porcello earned his first major league victory in his start on April 19 at Seattle. At 20 years, three months and 23 days, he became the youngest Tigers pitcher to record a victory since Bruce Robbins recorded a victory on August 28, 1979 at 19 years, 11 months and 28 days.

**YOUNGSTER IN HIS DEBUT:** Porcello made his major league debut on April 9 at Toronto at 20 years, three months and 13 days, becoming the youngest Tigers pitcher to start a game in his major league debut for the club since Bruce Robbins was 19 years old in his debut on July 28, 1979. Jeremy Bonderman was 20 years, five months and five days old when he made his major league debut for the Tigers on April 2, 2003 versus Minnesota.

**IT'S A FIRST:** Porcello made his major league debut on April 9 against the Blue Jays, opposing Toronto's Ricky Romero, who also made his major league debut. According to the Elias Sports Bureau and the Canadian Press, it marked the first time since the MLB Draft began in 1965 that two first-round selections making their major league debut squared off against each other.

**A FIRST WITH A TIGERS TWIST:** Porcello and Toronto's Ricky Romero made their major league debuts on April 9 in Toronto, marking the first time the Tigers have been involved in a such a matchup since August 8, 2001 at Texas when Nate Cornejo made his major league debut against Joaquin Benoit of the Rangers. Cornejo did not factor in the decision as the Tigers scored 13 runs in the top of the ninth inning to break a 6-6 tie and defeat the Rangers 19-6. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last time two pitchers making their major league debut faced each other was September 4, 2008 when Washington's Shairon Martis opposed Atlanta's James Parr.

**FLORIDA STATE LEAGUE LEADER:** Porcello led the Florida State League with a 2.66 ERA as he was selected to the league's mid- and post-season all-star squads in his first professional season in 2008. Additionally, he tied for second among all league starters with a .244 batting average against.

**PROSPECT STATUS:** Porcello was tabbed the 21st-best prospect in baseball prior to the start of the 2009 season by *Baseball America*. Additionally, he was named the top prospect in both the Tigers organization and Florida State League following the 2008 season by the publication.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Porcello was selected by the Tigers in the first round (27th overall) of the June 2007 draft.
