RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers snapped a four-game losing streak with a 6-3 win over the St. Louis Cardinals last night at Busch Stadium. Rick Porcello (8-4) allowed three runs (one earned) in 5.2 innings of work to earn the win for Detroit. Fernando Rodney worked a scoreless ninth inning for his 13th save. Marcus Thames homered and drove in two runs for Detroit, while Placido Polanco added a solo home run. The Tigers begin a six-game homestand with the first game of a three-game series versus the Milwaukee Brewers. Following an off day on Monday, the club begins a three-game series against the Chicago Cubs on Tuesday.

TIGERS RECALL DUSTY RYAN FROM TOLEDO: The Tigers today announced the club has recalled the contract of catcher Dusty Ryan from Triple A Toledo. Ryan was hitting .259 (38x147) with six doubles, seven home runs and 23 RBI in 46 games with Toledo.

INTERLEAGUE HAPPENINGS: Tonight's contest against the Brewers is Detroit's 10th game of interleague play in 2009. Since interleague play was started in 1997, the Tigers have compiled a 116-104 record. The Tigers are 51-33 in interleague games at Comerica Park. The Tigers are 3-6 during interleague action in 2009.

AMONG THE BEST SINCE 2006: The Tigers have compiled a 45-18 record during interleague play since the start of the 2006 season. The 45 wins and .714 winning percentage during interleague action are second-best among all major league clubs during that stretch. The Minnesota Twins have compiled a 48-15 record and .762 winning percentage during that stretch, the only club better than the Tigers.

HOME IS WHERE THE MOUND IS: In 28 games at Comerica Park this season, Tigers pitchers have compiled a 3.57 ERA (225.0IP/100ER). The Tigers are tops among all American League clubs with a .235 batting average against (221x939) at home in 2009, while the team is second with a 3.57 ERA.

PORCELLO ON A WINNING ROLL: Rick Porcello earned his eighth win of the season last night at St. Louis, tied for fourth in the American League. He has won seven of his last nine starts and according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first major league pitcher under 21 to win seven of nine starts since Dwight Gooden did so in 1985. Prior to Porcello, the last American League pitcher to do so was Jim Palmer in 1966.

MAGGLIO MASHES DURING INTERLEAGUE ACTION: Magglio Ordonez enters tonight's game versus Milwaukee hitting .338 (203x601) with 110 runs scored, 40 doubles, three triples, 32 home runs and 134 RBI in 162 games during his career in interleague play. He is third among all active major league players with a .338 batting average during interleague play, while he is ninth with a .574 slugging percentage.

THE LINE ON LYON: Brandon Lyon tossed a scoreless inning against the Cardinals last night. He has not allowed a run over his last seven outings, tossing 12.0 scoreless innings. Over his last 12 outings, Lyon has compiled a 1-0 record, 1.56 ERA (17.1IP/3ER) and 14 strikeouts.

POLANCO PACKS A PUNCH: Placido Polanco is hitting .341 (15x44) over his last 13 games for the Tigers. He is hitting .326 (184x564) in 145 games during his career in interleague action, 12th-best among all active major league players.

POP FROM THE TOP OF THE ORDER: Tigers lead-off hitters have combined for 16 home runs this season, second-most among all American League clubs. The club is second in the league with a .491 slugging percentage from the top spot in the order, while it is third with 28 extra-base hits.

RODNEY CONVERTS: Fernando Rodney converted his 13th save in his as many chances last night at St. Louis. It marks the longest such streak during a single season by a Tigers pitcher since Todd Jones converted his first 14 save opportunities April 11-June 22, 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Tigers starting pitchers enter tonight's game against the Brewers second in the American League with 8.75 hits per nine innings. They are fourth with a 4.09 ERA (384.2IP/175ER), .258 batting average against and 6.95 strikeouts per nine innings.

MARCUS MASHES: Marcus Thames has hit safely in nine of his 12 games for the Tigers since being activated from the disabled list on June 7, hitting .313 (10x32) with two home runs. Since joining the Tigers in 2004, he has homered once every 14.10 at-bats (1255AB/89HR) in 416 games. Thames is fourth among all American League players with a minimum of 1,000 plate appearances since the start of the 2006 season with a home run once every 13.65 at-bats (983AB/72HR) in 317 games.

BASES LOADED BONANZA: Detroit is second among all American League clubs with a .429 batting average (27x63) when hitting with the bases loaded this season. Detroit is leading all league clubs with five grand slams and 79 RBI with the bases loaded.

ARMANDO'S ANTIDOTE: In his second season with the Tigers, Galarraga is making his 14th start of the 2009 season this evening against the Cardinals.

SEEKING A WIN: Galarraga enters tonight's start against the Brewers having lost each of his last seven decisions. The seven-game losing streak is a career-long streak. He had two two-game losing streaks with Detroit in 2008.

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: Galarraga is making his seventh career start during interleague play this evening against the Brewers. In his previous six outings during interleague play, he is 3-2 with a 4.06 ERA (31.0IP/14ER).

LIMITING THE HITTING: Since the start of the 2008 season, Galarraga is 10th among all American League pitchers with 8.41 hits allowed per nine innings, while he is 11th with a .246 batting average against.

LOOKING TO LIMIT THE LONGBALL: Galarraga has surrendered at least one home run in each of his last nine starts for the Tigers, a total of 13 home runs. He allowed just one home run in his first four starts of the season.

RECORD AT COMERICA PARK: Galarraga is making his 20th career start at Comerica Park this evening. In his previous 19 starts, he is 7-6 with a 4.46 ERA (111.0IP/55ER).

ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES: During his major league career, Galarraga has limited righthanded batters to a .204 batting average (90x441). Lefties are hitting .281 (150x534) versus Galarraga.

ROOKIE LEADER: Galarraga topped all American League rookie pitchers with 13 wins and 126 strikeouts for the Tigers during the 2008 season, while he finished third with a 3.73 ERA.

WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC PARTICIPANT: Galarraga started two games for Venezuela during the World Baseball Classic this spring. In his two starts, he finished 1-0 with a 4.91 ERA (7.1IP/4ER) and six strikeouts.

OPENING DAY FIRST: Galarraga made the Tigers Opening Day roster, marking the first time he has been on an Opening Day roster at the major league level.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Galarraga was acquired by the Tigers from the Texas Rangers in a two-player deal on February 4, 2008. He originally signed with the Montreal Expos as a non-drafted free agent on October 31, 1998.
