**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers defeated the Chicago Cubs 5-3 last night at Comerica Park, marking the club's sixth consecutive victory. Zach Miner (5-1) tossed an inning of relief to pick up the victory, while Fernando Rodney tossed a scoreless ninth for his 15th save. Miguel Cabrera and Gerald Laird both belted solo home runs and finished with two hits, while Adam Everett and Magglio Ordonez both added a pair of singles. The Tigers conclude a six-game homestand with the final game of a three-game series versus the Chicago Cubs this afternoon. The club begins a nine-game road trip tomorrow evening with the first game of a three-game series against the Astros at Minute Maid Park. The trip also features stops in Oakland and Minnesota for three-game sets.

**SUPER STREAK AT COMERICA PARK:** The Tigers won their seventh consecutive game at Comerica Park last night against the Cubs. The seven-game winning streak at home is tied for the third-longest winning streak in the history of Comerica Park, matching a seven-game streak from June 25-July 9, 2008. The streak trails an eight-game streak earlier this season from May 5-22 and a 10-game streak from June 15-July 15, 2006.

**SUPER START AT COMERICA PARK:** The Tigers have posted a 22-11 record in the club's first 33 home games this season. The 22-11 record marks the best 33-game start in Comerica Park history and the best by a Tigers team at home since the 1984 club posted a 23-10 mark in the first 33 games at Tiger Stadium.

**LOOKING FOR HOME SWEEP HOME:** With a victory today, the Tigers would secure a sweep of all six games during the current homestand. It would mark the second time in Comerica Park history that the club has won every game on a homestand of six-or-more games, joining a six-game sweep of a homestand from June 23-28, 2006.

**POWER TRIO:** Miguel Cabrera belted his 15th home run of the season last night against the Cubs. He joins Curtis Granderson (17) and Brandon Inge (17) to form one of three major league trios with at least 15 home runs this season. The Tigers trio joins Tampa Bay's Evan Longoria (16), Carlos Pena (22) and Ben Zobrist (15) and Philadelphia's Ryan Howard (20), Raul Ibanez (22) and Chase Utley (16).

**DAYTIME DELIGHT:** The Tigers enter this afternoon's contest versus the Cubs with an 18-7 record in the club's 25 day games thus far in 2009. The team is hitting .293 (248x846) with 150 runs scored, 37 doubles, six triples and 25 home runs in 25 games during the day this season. The Tigers are tops among all American League clubs with a .293 batting average in day games this season. Club pitchers are second in the league with a 3.58 ERA (221.0IP/88ER) during day games this season.

**INTERLEAGUE HAPPENINGS:** Today's contest against the Cubs is Detroit's 15th game of interleague play in 2009. Since interleague play was started in 1997, the Tigers have compiled a 121-104 record. The Tigers are 56-33 in interleague games at Comerica Park. The Tigers are 8-6 during interleague action in 2009.

**AMONG THE BEST SINCE 2006:** The Tigers have compiled a 50-18 record during interleague play since the start of the 2006 season. The 50 wins and .735 winning percentage during interleague action are tied with the Minnesota Twins for the lead among major league clubs during that stretch.

**POLANCO PACKS A PUNCH:** Placido Polanco is hitting .333 (19x57) over his last 17 games for the Tigers. He is hitting .326 (188x577) in 149 games during his career in interleague action, 11th-best among all active major league players.

**HOME IS WHERE THE MOUND IS:** In 33 games at Comerica Park this season, Tigers pitchers have compiled a 3.57 ERA (295.0IP/117ER). The Tigers are tops among all American League clubs with a .239 batting average against (264x1103) at home in 2009, while the team is second with a 3.57 ERA.

**RODNEY CONVERTS:** Fernando Rodney converted his 15th save in as many chances last night against the Cubs. It marks the longest such streak during a single season by a Tigers pitcher since Todd Jones converted 19 straight June 10-August 30, 2006.

**LOVING THE LONGBALL:** The Tigers have belted multiple home runs in seven of the last eight games and the club is tied for the American League lead with 27 home runs since June 7. Detroit has at least one home run in a season-high eight consecutive games.

**TIGERS AGREE TO TERMS WITH TWO PLAYERS:** The Tigers today announced that the club has agreed to terms with two players selected in this year's Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft: shortstop Edwin Gomez (4th round selection) and lefthanded pitcher Giovanni Soto (21st round selection). Additionally, the club has agreed to terms with non-drafted free agent outfielder Jordan Cruz from Kansas State University.

**ARMANDO'S ANTIDOTE:** In his second season with the Tigers, Galarraga is making his 15th start of the 2009 season this afternoon against the Cubs.

**SEEKING A WIN:** Galarraga enters today's start against the Cubs having lost each of his last seven decisions. The seven-game losing streak is a career-long streak. He had two two-game losing streaks with Detroit in 2008.

**INTERLEAGUE ACTION:** Galarraga is making his eighth career start during interleague play this afternoon against the Cubs. In his previous seven outings during interleague play, he is 3-2 with a 4.37 ERA (35.0IP/17ER).

**RECORD AT COMERICA PARK:** Galarraga is making his 21st career start at Comerica Park this afternoon. In his previous 20 starts, he is 7-6 with a 4.54 ERA (115.0IP/58ER).

**LOOKING TO LIMIT THE LONGBALL:** Galarraga has surrendered at least one home run in each of his last 10 starts for the Tigers, matching Milwaukee's David Bush for the longest such streak this season. He has allowed 14 home runs during the streak after allowing just one home run in his first four starts of the season.

**ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES:** During his major league career, Galarraga has limited righthanded batters to a .205 batting average (93x453). Lefties are hitting .287 (155x540) versus Galarraga.

**ROOKIE LEADER:** Galarraga topped all American League rookie pitchers with 13 wins and 126 strikeouts for the Tigers during the 2008 season, while he finished third with a 3.73 ERA.

**WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC PARTICIPANT:** Galarraga started two games for Venezuela during the World Baseball Classic this spring. In his two starts, he finished 1-0 with a 4.91 ERA (7.1IP/4ER) and six strikeouts.

**OPENING DAY FIRST:** Galarraga made the Tigers Opening Day roster, marking the first time he has been on an Opening Day roster at the major league level.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Galarraga was acquired by the Tigers from the Texas Rangers in a two-player deal on February 4, 2008. He originally signed with the Montreal Expos as a non-drafted free agent on October 31, 1998.
